
Hello Ladies

The lost art of letter writing and Pen Pals

About 4 years ago, when the WI resolutions of mental health matters and alleviating loneliness had been voted on, Valerie Hughes, from Sutton WI, Norfolk federation, decided that a good way of helping was to set up a WI pen pal group.

It is very therapeutic writing letters, often you may do more or look at things in a different way so that you have plenty to write about. It is also really nice to get a hand written letter as opposed to a billor circular. Pen pals can be supportive, encouraging, an inspiration, a person to share highs and lows without being interrupted. There is something tangible, something to re read as often as you want.

Getting the word out was difficult as she wanted to keep it as a free service, so went to social media and the UWI FB group (often referred to as The Daisies) for help and a sub group 'The pen pal exchange' was set up. It now has over 1,000 members.

Once successful, National Federation promoted it too, it is mentioned on My Wi and WI Life has written about it several times.

Although Valerie is aware that potentially the loneliest people are not on line, this is the only way she can accept applications as she is not able to advertise her postal address for GDPR reasons. She hopes that those who do have internet access will apply for those who don't. To apply she asks the following questions and for the answers to be emailed to her. She only shares the applicants addresses with the pen pal she matches them to.

Name – Age - Marital status - Present or former employment - Interests and hobbies - A bit about your family - Full postal address

She aims to link members at the end of every month, hoping that their interests and backgrounds will be a common thread. This is not always easy, she is also mindful of how near members live to each other as if too close they may already know each other. The hope is that 'just' being in the WI and liking letter writing would be enough of a link.

The A to Z of Climate Change. "K" is for Kyoto Protocol.

Some years ago, I was a Member of a Forum named the International Chemicals Stakeholder Forum. I was privileged to represent the NFWI on this varied group of learned people. The overriding Agenda was Pollution of the Earth on land, in sea and in air by chemicals, typically generated by humans. One Topic, always on our Agenda, was the Kyoto Protocol. The latter was an international Treaty signed in Kyoto, Japan on 11th December 1997. There were 192 parties to the Protocol. The basis of the latter was that Greenhouse Gas emissions (GGE's) were leading to Global Warming, causing Climate Change, and that human intervention was driving it. Typically, the worst gases involved are CO2, and Methane. Others playing a smaller but still serious effect are nitrous oxide, perfluorocarbons and hydrofluorocarbons. Various countries, including the USA, Canada, Japan and Russia were no longer signatories to the Treaty at 2012. Their withdrawal targets were not possible to achieve.

Current Affairs in Science

A change from our usual Science by Number, to coincide with our new Committee name. Science is always Current. As we speak, scientists at the Wellcome Sanger Institute, Cambridge along with other International Organisations will be sequencing the genetic code of all 66,000 species of animals, plants protozoa (creatures with simple cell structures) and fungi in the UK. Plants and animals adapt to any environmental changes and these adaptations are stored in their genomes. Such changes are invaluable to scientists studying how humans can cope and adapt in a future of flooding, wildfires, drought, etc.

The study currently carried out in the UK is called The Darwin Tree of Life Project (originally the symbol of the WI) and was officially launched on 1st November 2018. It is estimated that it will

take ten years to complete. There are thought to be 1.5 million species living on Earth. This project is an incredible effort encompassing scientists from countries around the Globe.
