My husband and I have been to several courses there over the years. This November, as in some previous ones, we attended the 'Weekend with the Small Harp' organised by Harps North West. There were fifteen of us and we were taught in two groups, the 'steady' and the 'quick'. Our two tutors were young and enthusiastic women, both excellent musicians and teachers. They provided well thought out music for us, teaching us more about how to improvise and using words like tea, coffee, banana or humpty-clip clop to work out rhythms. Try saying them! COP 27: What does it mean and has it succeeded in its aims?

COP 27 has only recently drawn to a close. But what exactly is it all about? The name stands for the 27th Conference of Parties (or Nations) and this year it was held in Egypt. About 200 Heads of State gathered in the host country for high level discussions on the state of the climate. There were numerous "hangers-on" from various climate-related groups. The previous COP climate summit was held last year in Glasgow. Of roughly 190 countries taking part then, and committing to attempting to reduce their dependence on Fossil Fuels (Gas, Oil, Coal etc) and switch to renewable, clean sources of energy like Wind, Wave, Solar and Nuclear, only 29 remain committed to this pledge and are making determined efforts to move forward in this direction. Poor nations need financial help to bring about this transition.

COP 27 was scheduled to deliver on the outcomes of the Glasgow summit. Unfortunately, it failed to do so. There was no discussion on reducing emissions, no further pledge on reduction of use of fossil fuels; no discussion on keeping global temperature rise to 1.5 degrees above preindustrial levels. At present, the world is heading on a downward, slippery slope towards a 2.7 degree rise by 2030. This is unsustainable.

The final document to arise from an otherwise disastrous meeting was to set up a loss and damage fund to which countries could contribute on a pro rata basis to aid those affected by any climate-related disaster.

Currently only 10% of climate finance reaches local communities, an appalling situation. India and China have refused to contribute to the fund, despite being two of the largest emitters. Their feeling is that they should be treated as poorer nations. But the idea of a loss or damage fund is to focus on any country, anywhere which has suffered disastrous floods, wildfires, famines or droughts, climate related.

At present there is no agreement on the size of the fund, the contributors to it or the managers of it. These vitally important issues have been shelved, despite the conference overrunning by two days and will be dealt with at COP 28, next year, in Dubai, an oil-producing nation with no real sense of urgency.

COP 27 cost \$220 billion to stage. Nothing substantive was achieved. The planet on which we evolved as protectors is being systematically destroyed. It continues to suffer catastrophic disasters, biodiversity is lost and we still hurtle forward down the slope. Another year's delay. Can the planet wait?
