NFWI 2023 RESOLUTION - Clean rivers for people and wildlife

WIs should now consider how they wish their delegate to vote on the resolution at the NFWI Annual Meeting in Cardiff on 25<sup>th</sup> May 2023. All WIs get one vote on the resolution – for or against.

WIs may choose to give their link delegate discretion to decide how to vote after hearing the speakers and the debate at the Annual Meeting. Please ensure your WI makes it clear to the Office when casting your vote whether you are granting your Link Delegate discretion.

Federation Representatives and link delegates attending in-person will cast physical paper votes during the voting session. Federation Representatives and link delegates attending virtually will cast electronic votes via Electionbuddy during the voting session. Both physical voting papers and electronic voting links will be shared with Federation Representatives and link delegates in advance of the meeting. No votes may be cast before or after the meeting.

WIs are also encouraged to hold discussions to allow members to consider how they wish their delegate to vote. The NFWI will also be hosting a discussion event. Please see below for further details.

#### **WORLD EARTH DAY**



The morning of Saturday 22nd April - Thirsk Town Hall, Westgate, Thirsk, YO7 1QR, from 10.00am. We are taking part in this event at the request of EarthDay.org, "the world's largest recruiter to the environmental movement and working with more than 150,000 partners in over 192 countries to drive positive action for our planet". Many local environmental organisations and community groups are to join together to provide a showcase of the great variety of work being done in our area.

For good measure, WI Country Markets are due to offer their produce for sale. Our current campaigns - End Plastic Soup, SOS for Honeybees, Show the Love,

Great Big Green Weeks - follow a century of WI activity, now with the aid of the Climate Ambassadors,

directed against environmental degradation and climate change. The same theme is covered by this year's national resolution, calling for clean rivers for people and wildlife.

At 2.00pm there will be a lecture commemorating Joan Maynard MP, a Sowerby resident and leader of the National Union of Agricultural Workers, who promoted countryside issues.

Silicon is the second most abundant chemical element in the Earth's crust, second only to oxygen. It is a hard, silvery-grey material. It reacts chemically with oxygen to form a series of compounds called silicates,

present in rocks and sand. These are used extensively in the construction industry when mixed with cement. Silicates have been used for centuries to make such items as glass beads, vases and jewellery. Evidence of this is found in remains of early Egyptian and Chinese dynasties. Egyptian civilisations dating from 1500 BC used silicates as did the early Phoenicians. Evidence also exists showing that silicates were used to produce mortar in the construction of early human dwellings. Silicon is an essential element in biology. Only trace amounts are used in most animals but some sea sponges and micro-organisms secrete complex and ornate skeletal structures made of silica (silicon dioxide). The latter is also deposited in many plant tissues. The present Age may be described as the Silicon Age (or Digital or Information Age) because of the impact of the very small amounts of pure silicon (semiconductors) which have transformed the World Economy. Semiconductors are used in all computers including smartphones and other digital devices.

Another way in which Science forms a huge impact on all our lives. Can you imagine having a day out and leaving your phone on the kitchen shelf?
