Doris Wilkinson Bursary Report

As one of the lucky winners of a Doris Wilkinson bursary I benefitted last year from the award of 250 for educational purposes.

I learned that Doris Wilkinson had been an active and committed WI member, very involved in activities to enhance women's welfare. Our archives revealed that she belonged to 2 WI groups in the north of the Federation's territory.

She died in 1995 and left money for charitable purposes. The Chairman of the time Olive Davey corresponded with her solicitors and we received a substantial legacy, which is held in trust for the benefit of members, and the interest on which is annually put towards attendance on educational courses - originally just from Denman, and now from any provider. Certainly something to be grateful for.

I took an online course on surrealism with the Courtauld Institute of Art, part of the University of London. We covered its early 20th-century roots, in which theosophy played a large part, and the

social and political contexts in which the artists worked. Mondrian, Malevich, Kandinsky, Sonia Delaunay, Jackson Pollock - but also Sudanese and Lebanese practitioners. We learned (up to a point) how to analyse what the paintings meant, but also simply enjoyed the craftsmanship and the colourful use of symbols. *Lindsay Gee*

DUNNINGTON - Wednesday 1st May 2024 Bluebell Season in Hagg Wood. Dunnington WI have organised a **6-mile walk** to enjoy the beautiful blue carpet of bluebells starting at The Reading Rooms, Church Street, Dunnington, YO19 5PZ. It is a circular walk through the village to Holtby Wood and through to Holtby with its lovely church. There are also several stiles enroute with extensive views of the surrounding countryside to the hills beyond. Wearing of boots is recommended. Dogs are welcome if they can negotiate kissing gates but will not be able to come into the Reading Rooms for lunch. The starting point is the Reading Rooms where toilets will be available before the walk starts. Lunch will be served there on our return. Meet at 10.00 am for a 10.30 start. A Gliding Taster Session - Back by Popular Demand - Saturday 28th June, 6.00pm for 6.30pm, Wolds Gliding Club The Airfield, Pocklington, YO42 1NP.

Yes, you too can fly like a bird! Enjoy the thrill of soaring over the Vale of York at the controls of a modern two-seater training glider with a BGA qualified gliding instructor when you join us for a taster gliding session. Flying will start at 6.30pm and will continue until everyone has had a flight. There may be the opportunity to pay for a second

flight if time allows at a cost of around £15. Even at the height of summer an airfield can be cool and exposed so please wear warm loose-fitting clothing. Jeans, jumpers and trainers are best and remember to bring a lightweight waterproof jacket too. If the weather is poor the flying will be rearranged for another date. After flying the clubhouse and bar will be open – alcohol will not be served prior to flying. Please bring a picnic which we can enjoy outside if it is warm enough or in the clubhouse if it is too cold. The gliders used, impose a weight limit of 102kg (16st 0lbs) and a height limit of 199cm (6ft 3in). You will be asked to make a medical declaration that you are fit to fly – the requirements are basically the same as those to drive a car. **Cost £30.00 members £32.00 non-members.
