Amar became known to millions through the groundbreaking BBC2 reality series, Beyond Boundaries (series 1), a jungle endurance expedition across Central America. As well as

The answer is that we are receiving more and more payments direct from members into the Federation Bank Account as payment for Federation Events. We don't always receive a Booking Form from the Website or an email from the member to say that this payment has been made – the payments do not always carry an Event Booking Code or tell us which W.I. the member belongs to. We then have to use MCS to tally the payment to a member. This is not always an easy task if the spelling of the name on the MCS is incorrect or the member is known by her middle name. 

Science Suggestions – As many of you may know my real passion is gardening, and it is from this aspect we can look at Science. At this time of the year – we should be seeing everything jumping into life. Sadly, this year everything is still cuddling up to keep warm. On the good days, we have had a few, you might, like me, be amazed at how many ladybirds are around. *(ladybird larvae)* 



Ladybirds are a member of Coccinellidae - a widespread family of small beetles. Not to be

mistaken for lily beetle – same size, more elongated, same colour, no spots but not a gardeners friend as they decimate lily plants. These small creatures will have hidden away all winter and emerged on a sunny day. They will have mated, and you will, if you look hard, find the larvae – a strange orange looking creature. Ladybirds are very good for our gardens; they happily munch away on aphids, green fly, and white fly. They are pollinators too. You can buy ladybirds online if you need too. So next time you are out in your garden, or walking, watch out for ladybirds. *(Lily beetle)*

**Climate Concerns** - I am amazed that since I took on the role of Climate Ambassador how much information there is in everyday life about Climate Change.

Ok, we are limited in how much we ourselves can do to help, but in each small act we do will in the long term make a difference. We can be thoughtful in how we use water. Just now we are experiencing a lot of rain. Our reservoirs are full but in no time at all the sun will come out and we will be threatened with hosepipe bans. We should think about fuel and see if we can use less – and also save money.

Many of you will know that I used to live on the Isle of Arran and am always interested in what happens there. Seven years ago, they should have had a new Dual Fuel Ferry. After many delays the new ferry is about to do its finals trials- Dual Fuel you ask- a combination of marine diesel and LNG – Liquefied natural Gas. The LNG has to be transported from Qatar (by sea) to Kent – 8000 miles and then from Kent to Ardrossan (South of Glasgow) 460 miles – and then they call it green fuel.
